SONG OF GATHERING & PREPARATION

The people of God always sang as they ascended the hill in Jerusalem up to the temple to worship (see Psalms 120-134). We, as well, prepare our hearts, minds, and bodies for worship by singing about the God we serve.

Come As You Are

CALL TO WORSHIP | Isaiah 55:6-9 (ESV)

We read God's Word, the Bible, together. It reveals to us who God is and what He expects of us.

"Seek the Lord while he may be found; call upon him while he is near; let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; let him return to the Lord, that he may have compassion on him, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, declares the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."

PRAYER OF ADORATION & CONFESSION

We pray together praising God for who He really is (Adoration) and admitting our inability to live up to what He expects of us (Confession).

ASSURANCE OF PARDON | Psalm 103:10-12 (ESV)

We read God's Word together and are reminded that mercy and grace are freely given to all who have faith in Jesus Christ.

He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us.

WORSHIP THROUGH GIVING

We respond to the good news of God's mercy and grace for us in Jesus by giving generously to the work of His church and the kingdom of God.

CONFESSION OF FAITH

As an expression of our faith in Jesus Christ in solidarity with his people, we declare the substance of what we believe.

From the Heidelberg Catechism:

- Q. 12. According to God's righteous judgment we deserve punishment both now and in eternity: how then can we escape this punishment and return to God's favor?
- A. God requires that his justice be satisfied. Therefore the claims of this justice must be paid in full, either by ourselves or by another.
- Q. 13. Can we make this payment ourselves?
- A. Certainly not. Actually, we increase our debt every day.

SCRIPTURE PASSAGE & SERMON OUTLINE

Proclamation of God's Word

Text: Micah 5:1-5a, 10-11; 6:8; 7:18-20 (ESV) Title: Micah: Who Is Like The LORD? Teacher: Tim Rice

5:1 Now muster your troops, O daughter of troops; siege is laid against us; with a rod they strike the judge of Israel on the cheek. 2 But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days. 3 Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has given birth; then the rest of his brothers shall return to the people of Israel. 4 And he shall stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they shall dwell secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth. 5 And he shall be their peace. ... 10 And in that day, declares the Lord, I will cut off your horses from among you and will destroy your chariots; 11 and I will cut off the cities of your land and throw down all your strongholds; ... 6:8 He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God? ... 7:18 Who is a God like you, pardoning iniquity and passing over transgression for the remnant of his inheritance? He does not retain his anger forever, because he delights in steadfast love. 19 He will again have compassion on us; he will tread our iniquities underfoot. You will cast all our sins into the depths of the sea. 20 You will show faithfulness to Jacob and steadfast love to Abraham, as you have sworn to our fathers from the days of old.

INTRO: When have you seen the powerful threaten the weak?

HIS WAYS, NOT OUR WAYS

In what ways does the LORD work differently than we do?

THE ENDANGERED HERO

How does Jesus do what we were made for but have never been able to do?

THE CALL TO LOVE & HUMILITY

How has the LORD called us to Himself and to His ways?

YOU CAN PRAY WITH US ...

- 1. Worship the LORD for His compassion and grace to sinners like us. Praise Him, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, that He is not like us, that His thoughts are not like our thoughts, and that His ways are not like our ways.
- 2. How have you lived as if you deserve the highest place, refusing to live humbly? Confess your pride as a true effort to replace Jesus as God. Ask Him to forgive you and change your heart to bow before Him *truly*.
- 3. Give thanks to Jesus for the beauty of what Jesus did to go into peril to rescue us from sin, death and hell. Thank Him for moving down so radically to do what we could never do *atone for our sins and secure us in love.*
- 4. Who do you know that tends quickly toward pride or superiority? Pray for them, asking the Lord to open their eyes to God's love of humility and His design so that we can walk humbly with Him.
- 5. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you grow in compassion for the weak and those who offer you no advantage. Pray for His work to so secure you in His resurrection power that you're unafraid to live humbly and in true love for others.
