Welcome to Reformation Sunday. In the sixteenth century, God stirred His Church through renewal movements we now call the Protestant Reformation. Through a renewed study of Scripture, the Gospel's light broke forth with renewed clarity: we are saved by grace alone (*sola gratia*), through faith alone (*sola fide*), in Christ alone (*solus Christus*), according to Scripture alone (*sola Scriptura*), for the glory of God alone (*soli Deo gloria*).

Today, we commemorate the Reformation and remember the ever-present call to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ through Missions.

We Listen to God's Word | Genesis 39:1-6a & Daniel 6:1-5

[1] Now Joseph had been brought down to Egypt, and Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, the captain of the guard, an Egyptian, had bought him from the Ishmaelites who had brought him down there. [2] The LORD was with Joseph, and he became a successful man, and he was in the house of his Egyptian master. [3] His master saw that the LORD was with him and that the LORD caused all that he did to succeed in his hands. [4] So Joseph found favor in his sight and attended him, and he made him overseer of his house and put him in charge of all that he had. [5] From the time that he made him overseer in his house and over all that he had, the LORD blessed the Egyptian's house for Joseph's sake; the blessing of the LORD was on all that he had, in house and field. [6] So he left all that he had in Joseph's charge, and because of him he had no concern about anything but the food he ate.

[1] It pleased Darius to set over the kingdom 120 satraps, to be throughout the whole kingdom; [2] and over them three high officials, of whom Daniel was one, to whom these satraps should give account, so that the king might suffer no loss. [3] Then this Daniel became distinguished above all the other high officials and satraps, because an excellent spirit was in him. And the king planned to set him over the whole kingdom. [4] Then the high officials and the satraps sought to find a ground for complaint against Daniel with regard to the kingdom, but they could find no ground for complaint or any fault, because he was faithful, and no error or fault was found in him. [5] Then these men said, "We shall not find any ground for complaint against this Daniel unless we find it in connection with the law of his God."
