MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

As we enter Advent—a season of watching and waiting for Christ—I find myself returning to a moment from worship this fall. One Sunday morning, we watched a video of children around the world receiving Operation Christmas Child boxes. Their smiles were wide, their joy unrestrained, their gratitude overflowing. And a quiet thought rose in me:

“We need to learn from them as well.”

That moment planted the seed for this year’s Advent theme: Christ Among Us. This season, we will explore the four Advent themes—Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love—through scripture and through wisdom from different cultures where God’s Spirit is already moving.

Each week pairs scripture with a meaningful word:

- Hope — *Ubuntu* (South Africa): “I am because we are.” Hope grows when we remember we belong to one another.
- Peace — *Bulong & Orasyon* (Philippines): Traditions of whispered prayers and spoken blessings that remind us peace begins gently.
- Joy — *Pachamama* (Peru): A posture of gratitude that turns ordinary life into celebration.
- Love — *Theosis* (Middle Eastern Christianity): The invitation to grow into the likeness of Christ.

We are not replacing our story—only widening our wonder. Advent tells us the good news is for all people, and sometimes those very people become our teachers.

May this season draw us closer to Christ and to our neighbors near and far.

CHRISTMAS EVE SPECIAL DONATION

- The Firelands Local School District student cafeteria fund. This donation will be used by food service workers to pay for lunches for students not having enough money to purchase a meal.
- Reach Our Youth Program. Reach Our Youth (ROY) is a one-to-one mentoring program that matches volunteers with local children in Huron County who need a role model and an extra friend in life. ROY aims to help youth grow into well-adjusted adults who can contribute positively to their community.

Donations to this program help kids in the program by providing fun activities for them to participate in, purchases supplies that the program may need, and some program development.

All Christmas Eve donations will be split between these two organizations, unless otherwise specified.


HOLIDAY MUSIC








When you enter the new double doors you will see our old side entrance to the right and the new lift to the left.


