MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

No, I was walking upstairs to say "I do" to Joel Ross. But the vision stayed with me.

God has been at work in each of us from the day we were born. Often, we have strayed – sometimes even getting tied up in bramble bushes as we veered off the path, but God has patiently and persistently called us back to our path. I rejoice that our paths have joined. I rejoice in the lessons each of us, individually and collectively, have learned along our journeys – even, and maybe especially, the hard lessons learned on the side of the road. I rejoice in the lessons yet to be learned, the ministry yet to unfold, the love and grace yet to deepen even more.

ACCESSIBILITY PROJECT UPDATE

The Trustees have received a quote from Access Solutions for a lift that would transport individuals from ground level to the basement and to the sanctuary level.

The Trustees have met with Janotta and Herner twice and expect to get quotes and architectural/engineering plans by March for the project. John Krumwiede has offered to help with the removal of the existing access ramp. Total scope, design, costs and funding are yet to be determined. Church Council and the congregation will be informed as more details become available.

GRIEF SHARE



Grief Share Support Group



This 13-week grief support group program focuses on important grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The weekly videos feature nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, and the video is followed by a small group discussion about what was viewed. Past participants have related how helpful the information and follow-up discussions were to them.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing when friends or family have returned to their daily life routines. Too often people, including Christians, tend to stuff their grief instead of allowing it to do the God-given work for which it is intended. Don't allow fear of what others may think to keep you from what could help you. Confidentiality is very much a part of this program.

Your bereavement experience may be recent or not so recent. You will find encouragement, comfort, and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend. No matter what the cause of your loved one's death, this is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and that you do not need to live in bondage to certain emotions. You will learn valuable information about dealing with the changes in your life and renewing your hope for the future.

GriefShare will meet at the church for 13 weeks on **Wednesdays from 6:00-8:00pm starting April 2**.

Cost: The course is FREE. However, participants will want to purchase a \$20 workbook. Scholarships for the workbook are available.



CHURCH PARSONAGE

At the January 2025 annual meeting, Trustee chairman, Steve Dillon, reported that the Trustees and Church Council would like the congregation to consider the sale of the church parsonage. Currently the house is vacant with no rent to cover expenses. Additionally, there are concerns associated with a non-profit organization operating as a landlord.

A motion was made at the meeting that the Trustees be authorized to offer the parsonage, located at 22 Cooper Street in Wakeman, for sale. Discussion followed, including how to proceed with a proposed sale. Brenda Friend and Bruce Leimbach have had experience in the sale of property, and they would be willing to take the lead on this project. During the sale, the trustees indicated that they will use an attorney to prepare a purchase agreement and a title company for the title transfer details.

A vote of the membership approved the proposed sale of the parsonage. Final sale and designation of the sale funds will be contingent upon congregational approval.
