Over 30 children came forward to listen to the children's message.


Once again our walls were filled with over one hundred people who came to celebrate the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Dear Wakeman Friends,

Merry Christmas 2018 to you! News of 2018—my 21st year of "retirement" WOW!! 21 Years!!

I have preached 6 Sundays in 6 churches (1 UCC, 2 Methodist, 1 Presbyterian, 2 Disciples of Christ, in 2 states —OH & WV). Not bad for 82 right??!!

In June I drove alone (with Irene's blessing) 2,269 miles in 13 days for great 1-1 visits with each of my kids in NH & VT, and to Maine —-see niece , seafood, and ocean.

On Oct. 1 Irene and I celebrated our 13th wedding anniversary with overnight at beautiful Ohio State Park Burr Oak Lodge overlooking the lake. But...Oct 23 Irene tripped, fell hard, fractured her hip; had surgery, then 38 days in brand new rehab facility in Belpre just 10 miles from home. She worked hard in therapy, has great spirit, now home. We're adjusting; working together, keeping going.

I'm basically OK. Checkups good. Am using hearing aids. Little night driving. I'm physically active—got my weight down to 175 from 185 by more walking, exercising, cutting carbs, eating less. Use just Vitamins, herbs, and only 1 Rx. My greatest joy: riding my Piaggio BV Tourer 350 cc motorscooter 2,316 miles on 28 rides, (a total now of 35,531 miles on 488 rides since starting at age 70 in June 2006.) I love the freedom of putting along at 25-30 mph through the peaceful countryside, while praying lots of thankful prayers for the life I've had!!

In 2017 I gave 50% of my income to 77+ causes for a more peaceful, safe, and healthy world for all persons. With God's help, we'll each keep using who we are, and what we have, to be kind, loving, & helpful....like Jesus. Nearing age 83, I'm still seeking to "Do all the good you can, to all the people you can, in all the ways you can, as long as you can." (John Wesley) I hope you are too! The world sure needs all the caring we can do. This may be my last Christmas letter. Thanks for being in my life!!
