## Here are some **IMPORTANT IDEAS** we discover in these verses:

- We only become part of the kingdom of God by believing in Jesus, and surrendering our hearts to God's loving leadership.

# An **ENCOURAGEMENT** in light of God's word:

(Toddler/PreK) Talk to God and thank Him that every person, including children are important to Him. Thank Him that He loves you and cares for you. Ask Him to help you love Him with your whole heart and to help you love and care for others the way He does for you.

(Elementary) Talk to God, thanking Him for His great love for all people, including children. Thank Him for His love and care for you. Think about your own heart. Ask Him to help you love Him with your whole heart, and to help you love and care for others the way He does for you. Do you come to God with your whole heart? With childlike humility (cf. Matthew 18:4)? You might want to talk to Him in this way: Admit you are guilty of living a me-centered life instead of a God-centered one. Believe that Jesus is your only hope for forgiveness, freedom, and forever with God. With your whole heart and being, commit yourself to following Jesus' loving leadership. If you pray this, or have questions about what it means, talk to a trusted adult in your life about it.
