Our trip to Louisville for Together for the Gospel was cancelled, as was our time in Southern Ontario where we had planned to meet with prospective partners and spend some time with those that have already come on board in support of our ministry. As of mid-March, Zach's reporting date for Mirabel was halted until further notice in light of travel restrictions in response to COVID-19. From what we understand, the prescribed social distancing is affecting all corners of our nation, so for now the decision to put a pause on relocating seems wise. Two immediate benefits are that we have more time to secure our remaining financial support as well as more time to continue our French lessons with John-William from New Hampshire. Pray for us as the coming months take shape.

One more benefit of an extended time in Sioux Lookout is that we get to be involved in our local church's recent push towards missional communities and discipleship/home groups. Last Sunday evening we opted for a virtual hangout via Zoom and we had a great time talking and sharing and brainstorming specific ways to be intentional and strategic about discipleship. Pray for this discipleship-driven vision of ministry to take hold in our members as well as boldness to walk in it. Pray that when we leave, others will eagerly step into these leadership roles and grow in their specific gifts.

We look forward to sharing our next steps with you in the coming weeks as God leads our families closer towards the harvest in Quebec.
