We are learning how much people in this neighbourhood support each other and the local businesses. In the midst of this large city, our neighbourhood feels like its own small town.

Zach has experienced many ups and downs in his training position with NAV Canada in Mirabel. Small successes bring energy and excitement and small failures bring disappointment and doubt. The next few weeks are an important time for Zach and his work here, and so we ask you to pray with us for Zach, that God would grant him grace to do his job well and trust that the outcome belongs to the Lord. Aaron has begun full-time language studies. He has in-person classes every other day that go along with daily online assignments. Evaluating your own progress in language learning can be difficult, however he is feeling confident that his French comprehension is growing quickly and is working hard at his oral production. Pray that God would grant Aaron the ability to retain language and the perseverance needed to devote time to learning. Melissa and Olive have taken on the enormous responsibility of discipling our children through the everyday wildness that is our lives right now with grace and patience. Listening to the same French nursery rhymes over and over and over and over, making snacks, watching silly French children's shows, making snacks, reading books, making more snacks, ending conflicts by making snacks. Pray for Melissa and Olive that they would be encouraged in both mind and spirit as they care for our children well.

As we have begun our integration into Quebec much has been made of our need and desire to learn French. It is equally as important to us that we establish habits and rhythms in our lives that communicate the beauty and power of the gospel. Our desire to share the gospel with people in Quebec drives us to not only know and communicate the gospel with our words but also to know and communicate the gospel by the way that we live life together. The way we live together is one of the greatest apologetics of the gospel that we have, so we are spending time establishing habits and routines that communicate to ourselves and others that we believe the gospel we proclaim. We are filled with hope that God might use these small acts of worship for his glory through the salvation of our neighbours in Ouebec.











One of these routines or "habits of grace" that we have established is Family Worship. Monday, Wednesday and Friday evenings after we finish supper together we gather in the living room for a time of worship. As we take our seats on the couch or floor we watch a short video or song with the kids that engages their minds with our focus for that evening. Some evenings we read a passage of scripture, followed by a short devotion and its significance in our lives. Some evenings we allow the scripture passage we've read to lead us into a time of prayer. Each evening after we have heard from God through His Word we worship Him in song. With Zach on piano, Sage on kazoo, Weston with the egg shaker and Sawyer with whatever toy he claims as an instrument that evening, we unite our voices in praise to our King. As you can imagine with three young children some nights are wonderful and some nights we spend more time putting out fires than we would like, but in all circumstances we desire to be fervent in worship of Christ. This is one of those life-giving habits that we desire to invite others into as we have opportunity. This may seem small or simple but our God uses small, simple faithfulness in the everyday to accomplish his grand and magnificent plans.
