




Zach, Olive and Sage moved into our new house on October 1st (a quick shout-out to the Praca family for lending us a mattress while we waited for our stuff to arrive!) and the Murray's arrived on October 9th with the moving truck. As of right now, just about everything is unpacked with the exception of our wall-art and we are beginning to adjust to what life looks like now. Montreal and some of its surrounding regions were recently brought back into the red zone for COVID-19 until the end of October, which significantly limits the kind of social interactions we can have legally, but despite this, there is still much to learn and grow accustomed to. Even simple things like walking around our new neighbourhood, getting groceries, bumping into our neighbours outside, ordering coffee en français, taking the metro, finding a parking spot on the street, and so on and so forth — everything is new and different, and so it is a comforting thought that in all the "new and different" of our lives, Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever. Jesus is our sure and steady anchor. It is our hope this month to establish rhythms in our home that will encourage us to focus on Christ and abide in him, finding time to worship together through the reading of the Word, songs, and prayer.





This month we begin the integration phase of our ministry. Integration consists of many things, the main two for us being language learning and cultural acquisition. It is our desire to be a part of healthy churches being planted here in Quebec amongst francophone Canadians, therefore, it is vital that we learn French. Much of the next few months will be focused on learning as much French as we can, as effectively as we can. Along with immersing ourselves in as many French language situations as we can, we are also going to be utilizing a government endorsed program called Francisation, designed to help immigrants to Quebec learn French As gospel workers, having the proper tools to communicate the gospel message to French-speakers is imperative to our call to serve the Lord in Quebec. In the service of Christ we are joyfully compelled to serve others, so it is our desire to understand the people around us so that we might serve and love them well. We are committed to learning about Quebec culture from the people and places around us. The apostle Paul said that to the Jews he was a Jew and to the Gentiles he became a Gentile so that by every means necessary he might win some (1 Cor. 9:20-23). In this way, we want to imitate Paul as he imitated Christ so that by every means necessary we might see the souls of people in Quebec added to the Kingdom of God. We look forward to sharing with you some of the things we learn along the way, so that you might be able to pray with us for the people here.
