Peter & a Disciple's Conviction (4/7/24)

Main Verses: Luke 5:1-11 Key Verse: Luke 5:8 'Takeaway': When Peter truly sees Jesus for who he is, he truly sees himself & who he should be, but isn't.

Getting Started: Did you ever realize that you're not as good as you thought?



READ Luke 5:1-11 (or have older kids help read).

Some **QUESTIONS** to consider:

Here are some **IMPORTANT IDEAS** we discover in these verses:

Toddler/PreK:

- They had been fishing all night & caught nothing.
- Jesus tells them to drop their nets.
- Simon (Peter) tells Jesus they have toiled all night & caught nothing; but he always obeys Jesus & drops the nets.
- When they dropped the nets they caught so many fish that their boats began to sink. Simon (Peter) realizes Jesus is Lord of the sea & all that is in it; he also realizes how small & unworthy he is. Peter sees himself as he **really** is (sinful) & he sees Jesus as the Holy One.
- Jesus reassures Simon (Peter) & tells him that he will be catching men now. Peter responds by **leaving** everything & following Jesus.

Elementary:

- They had been fishing all night & caught nothing.

- Simon (Peter) tells Jesus they have toiled all night & caught nothing; but he always obeys Jesus & drops the nets.

- Jesus reassures Simon (Peter) & tells him that he (along with James & John) will be catching men now. Peter responds by leaving everything & following Jesus.

An **ENCOURAGEMENT** in light of God's word:

(Toddler/PreK) Talk to God. Thank him that when we see ourselves as we really are (sinful people), we can know that he is the Holy One who has made a way (thru faith in Jesus) for us to know God, love him, & serve him as part of his amazing mission. Ask God to help you grow in your knowledge of, & love for, him each day.

(Elementary) Talk to God. Thank him that when we see ourselves as we really are (sinful people), we can know that he is the Holy One who has made a way (thru faith in Jesus) for us to know him, love Him, & serve him as part of his amazing mission. Thank God that we can know that we are sinful & in need of him because of the holiness of Jesus. Ask him to help you recognize your need for him & his rescue from your sinful life. If you recognize that need, you might want to pray in this way: **Admit** you are guilty of living a me-centered life instead of a God-centered one. **Believe** that Jesus is your only hope for forgiveness, freedom, & forever with God. With your whole heart & being, **commit** yourself to following Jesus' loving leadership. If you pray this, or have questions about what it means, talk to a trusted adult in your life about it.
