Lesson Aim:	To help kids understand that God gives us JOY in good times and bad.

This week's story:	Paul and Silas in Prison Acts 16:16-40
Main Takeaways:	The Holy Spirit works in us to guide our hearts and minds towards things we have to be thankful for, rather than allowing us to focus on pain and disappointment. Anyone can be happy when things are going right, but it's those who joy shines through even when things aren't going "right" that show God's love to others and to the world.

Questions and
Potential
Answers:

Q: Tell about a time when someone was really bothering you (like a brother or a sister). What did you do about it.

A: Answers will vary

Q: What did Paul do to stop the girl who was bothering him and Silas?

A: He commanded the spirit to come out of her.

Q: Why were the girl's owners so upset?

A: Without the spirit the girl could no longer tell fortunes and make money for her owners.

Q: What happened to Paul and Silas because they freed this girl from the evil spirit?

A: They were beaten and thrown into prison.

Q: How would you feel if you were beaten and thrown into prison for helping someone?

A: Answers will vary. (Angry, upset, sad, life is unfair...)

Q: What did Paul and Silas do instead of getting angry and complaining? How did they respond to a bad circumstance?

A: They prayed and sang praises to God.

Q: How could they have joy in a bad circumstance? A: They focused on what God had done for them in Jesus instead of how hard their circumstance was. They believed

God was in control and working for their good, even though it didn't feel like it at the time.

Q: What happened to the jailer as a result of Paul and Silas singing?

A: The jailer came to believe in Jesus, was baptized, and filled with joy.

Q: The next time things don't go "right" for you or you end up in bad circumstance, what can you do to have joy like Paul and Silas had?

A: I need to focus on what Jesus has done for me instead of my circumstance and believe that God is in control and working for my good, even if it doesn't feel like it.

Your favorite uncle is coming for a visit. Move ahead 1 space.	It's Christmas! Move ahead 3 spaces.	You got a raise in your allowance. Move ahead 1 space.
You got a new puppy.  Move ahead 1 space.	Your fish died. Go back 1 space.	It's your birthday! Move ahead 2 spaces.
You got your tonsils out. Go back 3 spaces.	You didn't get the part you wanted in the school play.  Go back 1 space.	You get to go to Disneyland for vacation. Move ahead 3 spaces.
You made a new friend. Move ahead 1 space.	You lost your tickets to a NBA game. Go back 1 space.	The neighborhood kids are mad at you. Go back 1 space.
Your mom made you your favorite breakfast. Move ahead 1 space.	The chain on your bike broke.  Move back 2 spaces.	You made it to the next level on your favorite video game.  Move ahead 2 spaces.
You get to have a playdate! Move ahead 2 spaces.	It's family movie and pizza night!  Move ahead 2 spaces.	You got to make slime with your family. Move ahead 1 space.

Go back 2 spaces.

You accidentally broke your brother or sister's favorite toy.

Go back 2 spaces.

Your parents made brownies and ice cream for dessert.

Move ahead 1 space.


