What is Lent?

How do we get ready to celebrate Good Friday and Easter Sunday—two of the most important days of the Christian calendar? Over the years the church developed a tradition called Lent. Lent can be traced back to the 2nd century. During this season, new Christians would fast and study in preparation to be baptized on Easter Sunday. Eventually, entire congregations practiced Lent as a sign of Christian discipleship. It was a season of special emphasis on disciplines like living simply, prayer, fasting, giving to the poor and doing acts of service.

Christians counted forty days back from Easter (excluding Sundays), like Christ's forty-day fast in the desert (Luke 4), to determine the time frame of the Lenten journey.

Lent is a forty-day journey on which we can stop, look, and listen to what God is doing. It's a journey for which we should ask ourselves "What things do I need to leave behind so I can travel closer to Jesus? What things should I take with me?" On that journey, we stop to see what God wants us to do. We stop to see what saying "I'm sorry" looks like. We stop to see what it means to suffer for Jesus' sake and to see what the Bible says about Jesus' suffering. Finally, we walk, step by painful step, with Jesus on the road to the cross during passion week. It's a hard road, but it shines with glory on Easter morning when we celebrate Christ's resurrection!

Lent 2020: Legacy Campaign

Over the next five Sundays, our sermon series will anticipate Christ's passion at Easter by examining the lives of Jesus' closest followers and the LEGACY He left with His disciples. We will also explore ways Christians in history have prepared for Easter by learning Lenten practices.

PRAYER

Prayer may generally be described as that activity in which we are drawn closer to God in contemplation and communication. Prayer is our half of a conversation with God. That means that prayer is not only speaking, but listening as well. Jesus prayed (Mark 1:35), Jesus instructed his disciples to pray, Jesus taught his disciples to pray (Luke 11) and the scriptures say that the church is built on the prayers of God's people (Acts 2:42).

February 23rd - 29th (Start Using our Lent Prayer Calendar)

Take home a LEGACY 2020 CAMPAIGN prayer calendar and join *Grace* Sacramento in daily prayer for our church, our community, and our world and the Legacy season of giving this Lent.

FASTING

Fasting was practiced in the Old Testament and was recommended by Jesus both in example and teaching (Luke 4:2, Matt.6: 16-18, Mark 2:20). It is a practice that is designed to emphasize dependence on God and weaken attraction to things that cannot sustain us. Fasting is going without food or certain foods for designated periods during Lent. Abstinence from some activity (such as television, movies, entertainment, etc.) for designated time throughout the season is another way to observe the Lenten fast. Both are designed to give more attention and time to prayer and dependence on God.

March 1st - 7th (Fast)

Take the 7 day fasting challenge. Choose a regular item or activity to abstain from for one week (or for the remainder of Lent). Consider an item or activity that regularly costs you money and donate those funds to LEGACY. Example: Coffee (\$3.50/day x 7 days = \$24.50 to donate to Mexico/Grace)

SERVICE

The intention of this part of the Lenten discipline is to connect our faith in God's love for us with actions that are loving of others in the world. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16). Love is why Christ came. Love is why Christ died. Love is why God raised him from the dead. Love is the whole purpose and mission of the Church and of every Christian member: to show God's love in the world.

March 8th - 14th (Serve)

Sign-up to go on our Mexico mission trip / commit to help install flooring and other improvements at our GraceKids work day.

SIMPLICITY

Simplicity is a spiritual discipline that reorients our life by deliberately organizing it for a purpose. It is spiritual because simplicity deals intimately with the beliefs and views that lend shape and order to our lives. Our priorities show us the focus of our lives, and the way spend our time, our energy, and money along with the clutter of our homes becomes a reflection of our inner beliefs and intentionality. Simplifying is something we will have to work at and practice, because we have already created routines of business and convenience (Matt 6:21). Adhering our life to a focused center of Jesus reduces fracturedness, hurriedness and franticness.

March 15th - 21st (Simplify)

Take the simplicity challenge: Choose items to purge from your home and services or memberships (Hulu, Netflix, Carwash, etc) to cancel. Sell items on craigslist or have a garage sale - donate proceeds from sales and savings from to Mexico/*Grace*.

GIVING

Jesus presented giving to the needy as a necessary part of Christian life: "...when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing (Mt 6:2-3)." He does not say if you give alms, but when. Like fasting, prayer, and service, giving to those in need is part of following Christ.

March 22nd - April 12th (Give)

Take a *Legacy* label, place it on a tin can and fill it with your change throughout this Lenten season. Return your change along with an extra gift of your conviction to donate to Mexico/*Grace*.



April 1 (Wednesday)

Legacy Campaign: For this season of giving. For God to provide resources to build a house in Mexico and minister to a family in Ensenada. Pray that God will match us with the right family.

April 2 (Thursday)

Men's Ministry: As we prayerfully and thoughtfully create spaces for men to connect with one another and with God to talk to real needs and issues men face. For God to provide leaders who have a heart for ministry to men.

April 3 (Friday)

Worship Team: For Mia, as she prepares to lead three worship services this week: Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter. Pray for our musicians, singers and A/V teams.

April 4 (Saturday)

Pastor Daniel: As he prepares to preach on the disciple named Judas from John 12:1-16. Pray for our walk with God and continued journey in discipleship. Pray for Daniel's monthly work in gathering and networking with pastors in the city of Sacramento.

Week 7 (Holy Week)

April 5 (Palm Sunday)

Every Church: And every pastor in our city preparing for passion week and Easter. Pray that the message of the resurrection would be proclaimed with power across our city.

April 6 (Monday)

Jesus Cleanses the Temple: Pray that Grace Sacramento will be a worshipping church and one that seeks to serve those who find their way through our doors.

April 7 (Tuesday)

Jesus Confronts the Religious Leaders: Pray for those whom God has called to lead Grace Sacramento. Pray that our leaders would lead with humility, wisdom and discernment.

April 8 (Wednesday)

Jesus Anointed: A woman breaks an alabaster jar and begins to wash the feet of Jesus with her hair. Jesus praises her repentance and devotion and shows her forgiveness. Pray that in our repentance, we would remember our first love.

April 9 (Maundy Thursday)

The Last Supper: Pray for the ways we love each other at Grace. Pray that we would follow Christ's example of serving each other and washing each other's feet.

April 10 (Friday)

Good Friday: Spend time considering the ways we have sinned against Jesus. Pray for forgiveness. Pray for a deep anticipation and need for resurrection power in your life.

April 11 (Saturday)

Holy Saturday: For those who will worship for the first time or the first time in a long time tomorrow at Easter. Pray for Brad as he prepares to preach that the gospel would be clearly presented. Pray for relational connections at Grace.



Week 1

February 26 (Wednesday)

Ash Wednesday: As we begin our 40-day journey through Lent, that this season of "filling" and "emptying" will lead us closer to Christ.

February 27 (Thursday)

GraceKids: Pray for the many infants, toddlers and elementary students who fill our space. Pray that every child would hear the gospel in a way that they can understand every Sunday.

February 28 (Friday)

Mexico: For those considering going to Mexico this summer with our Family Mission team. Pray that God will provide the needed people to achieve our goal of building a house and continuing our relationship with the ministry there.

February 29 (Saturday)

Pastor Brad: As he prepares to preach on the disciple named James from Mark 10:35-45. Pray for our walk with God and continued journey in discipleship. Pray for his family: Olivia, Flannery, Asher and Story.

Week 2

March 1 (Sunday)

Grace Sacramento: That we would be a church that seeks to put Christ on display in Sacramento and in the neighboring communities.

March 2 (Monday)

The Homeless: Those who live in our neighborhood and often seek shelter under our awnings. Pray for health and permanent solutions to various reasons for their homelessness. Pray for Steve, our janitor - for warmth and safety on the streets.

March 3 (Tuesday)

The Diaconate: For our Mercy and Care team. That they would be good stewards of the resources we have as we use them to care well for the people and needs of *Grace* Sacramento.

March 4 (Wednesday)

Legacy Campaign: For this season of giving. For God to provide resources to build a house in Mexico and minister to a family in Ensenada. Pray that God will match us with the right family.

March 5 (Thursday)

Youth: For our growing youth ministry. That they would grow in grace and knowledge of Jesus to face the challenges of temptation and doubt.

March 6 (Friday)

Ladies of Grace: Pray for the gathering of women at Grace tomorrow as they seek to deepen in relationship with God and with each other. Pray for a fruitful time of fellowship.

March 7 (Saturday)

Pastor Daniel: As he prepares to preach on the disciple named Bartholomew from John 1:43-51. Pray for our walk with God and continued journey in discipleship. Pray for his family: Karen, Joshua, Caleb and Abigail.

Week 3

March 8 (Sunday)

March 19 (Thursday)

Legacy Campaign: For this season of giving. For God to continue to provide resources to build a house in Mexico and minister to a family in Ensenada. Pray that God will bless the family that we will be building a house for.

March 20 (Friday)

March 25 (Wednesday)

March 26 (Thursday)

March 30 (Monday)

Mercy & Care: For God to provide new leaders in our mercy and care ministry. Pray for people who want to train and prepare to join our Diaconate. Pray for our mercy ministry training through this Lenten season.

March 31 (Tuesday)

Missions Task Force: For God to provide new leaders for this new ministry to help with outreach training and begin the task of developing a missions philosophy that honors our mission and helps us focus on missions and outreach at home and around the world.
