

your King, and He is a wise, good, and loving King who is worthy of your trust and obedience.

Object Lesson — Building Blocks or Legos

Show a small creation made of building blocks.

Ask: Who built this? Who decides what happens to it?

Explain that the person who built it has authority over it, and in the same way, because God made you, He has authority over your life and knows what is best for you.

Day 5 — Your Maker Knows You and Cares for You

Scripture — Isaiah 43:1 “But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: ‘Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.’”

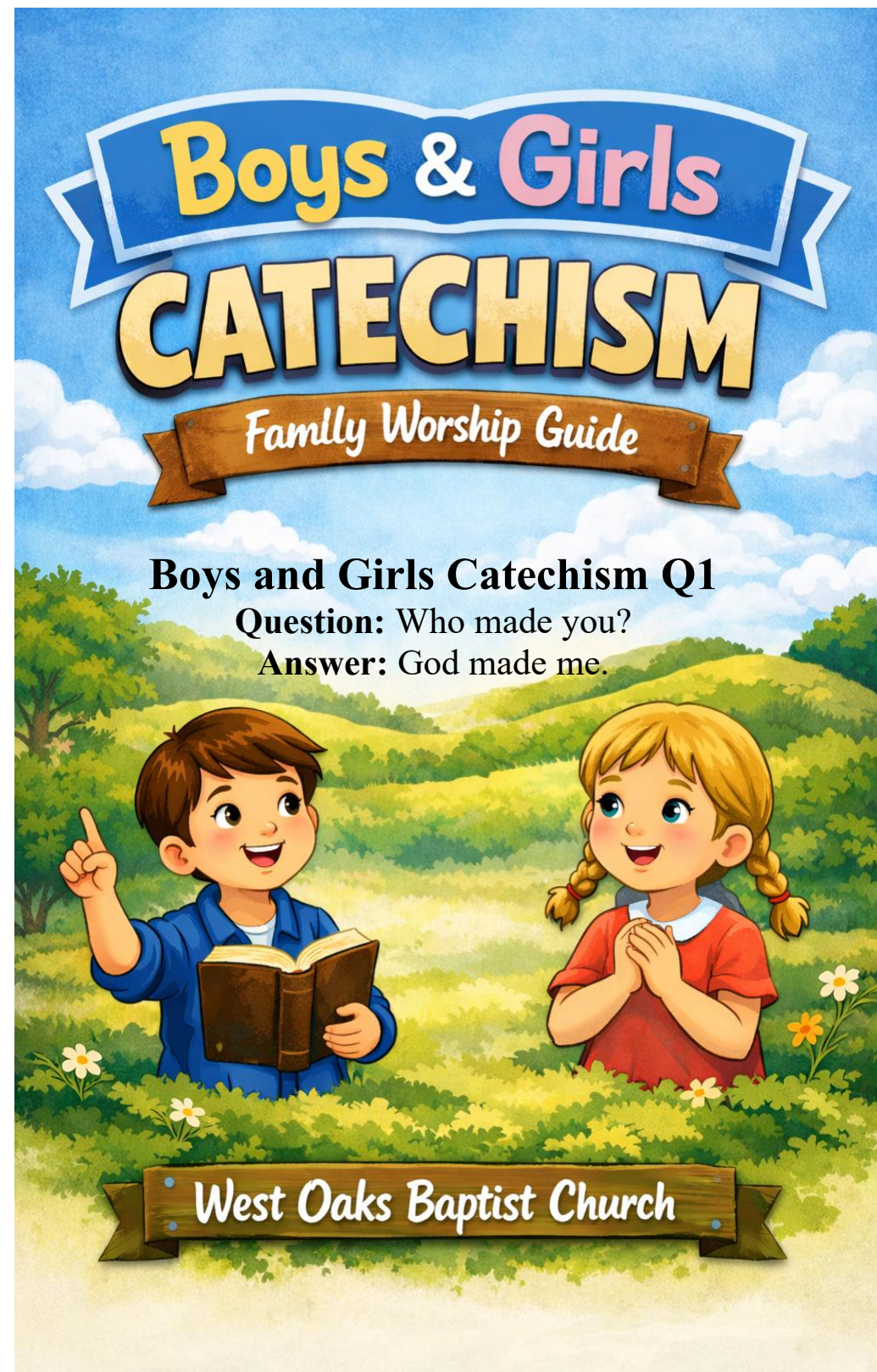
The truth that God made you is not only important because it means He is your King, but also because it means He knows you personally and cares deeply for you. God did not simply create the world and walk away, but He is involved in the lives of the people He made, knowing their names, their thoughts, and their needs. He knows when you are happy and when you are sad, when you are brave and when you are afraid, and He cares about every part of your life. Isaiah reminds us that God calls His people by name and says, “You are mine,” which shows His personal love and care. This means you are never alone, even when you feel alone, because your Maker is always with you. He understands you better than anyone else ever could. Because God made you and cares for you, you can trust Him, pray to Him, and rest in His love. Remember today that the One who made you is not distant, but near, and He lovingly watches over you.

Object Lesson — A Name Written in Book

Write your child’s name in a book or on paper.

Ask: Whose name is written here? Why would someone write your name down?

Explain that just as your name written down shows you are known and important, God knows your name because He made you, and He cares for you personally.



Day 1 — God Is Your Maker

Scripture — *Psalm 100:3* “Know that the LORD, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.”

Everything you see was made by someone. Your shoes were made in a factory. Your house was built by workers. Your toys were designed by someone. But who made you? God made you. You are not an accident. You are not random. God chose to make you. Before you were born, God already knew you and planned your life. This means your life has meaning and purpose. It also means you belong to Him. Psalm 100 says, “It is he who made us, and we are his.” Because God made you, He knows everything about you. He knows when you are happy and when you are sad. He knows your thoughts and your fears. And He cares for you. Just like a shepherd cares for his sheep, God cares for you. When you remember God made you, it helps you trust Him.

Object Lesson — Maker’s Mark

Show something with a brand name (shoe, cup, tool).

Ask: Who made this? How do you know?

Then ask again: Who made you? How do you know?

Day 2 — God Made Every Part of You

Scripture — *Psalm 139:14* “I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.”

God did not just make the world. He made every part of you. He made your eyes to see. Your ears to hear. Your hands to work. Your heart to love. Psalm 139 says you are “wonderfully made.” That means God made you carefully. He didn’t rush. He chose your hair color. He chose your height. He gave you your abilities. Even the things you wish were different were chosen by God. God never makes mistakes. You are exactly who God decided you should be. This helps us be thankful instead of complaining. It also reminds us God has a purpose for us.

Object Lesson — Puzzle Piece

Show puzzle pieces.

Ask: is each piece important for the puzzle? Why are they all different?

Explain each piece is different but important.

Day 3 — God Made You in His Image

Scripture — *Genesis 1:27* “So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.”

When God made you, He did something different than when He made the animals, trees, or stars, because He made you in His own image. This does not mean that God has a physical body like yours, but it means He made you so that you could know Him, love Him, think, speak, and live in a relationship with Him. God gave you a mind to learn truth, a heart to love what is good, and a will to choose what is right. This is part of what makes human beings so valuable and special in all creation. Every person you see was made by God in His image, which means we should treat others with kindness, patience, and respect, even when it is difficult. Understanding that God made you in His image also reminds you that your life has great purpose, because you were made to reflect His goodness in the way you live. When you obey Him, love others, and seek Him, you are living the way He designed you to live. Remember today that you were made by God to know Him.

Object Lesson — Coin with Image

Show a coin and ask whose image is on it.

Ask: Whose image is on this coin? Why is this image on it?

Explain that just as the coin shows the image of its maker or nation, you were made to show what God is like in how you live.

Day 4 — Because God Made You, He Is Your King

Scripture — *Revelation 4:11* “Worthy are you, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they existed and were created.”

Because God made you, He has rightful authority over your life, just as a builder has authority over what he builds and an author has authority over the story he writes. You belong to God, and your life is not your own to live however you please, but was given to you so that you might live for Him. This means God has the right to tell you what is true, what is right, and how you should live, and His commands are not meant to harm you but to guide you into what is good. Sometimes people think freedom means doing whatever they want, but real joy comes from living the way God designed you to live, because He knows you better than anyone else ever could. When you obey God, you are honoring your Maker and living according to His good purpose. When you disobey Him, you are living against the One who made you and loves you. Remember today that the God who made you is
