ADVANTAGES OF USING A CHURCH-WIDE READING PLAN:

- The whole Bible will be read in an orderly manner in the course of a year.
- No time is wasted guessing what to read AND what you read is being shared with other people in our fellowship.
- Parents have a guide to help disciple their children in all Scripture.
- Our church leadership knows where in Scripture the “flock” is feeding.
- Shared reading leads to opportunities for more meaningful conversations and increased unity.

TIPS:

- The head of the family should read over the chapters ahead of time. Make note of 2-3 verses that seem most timely for your family. After reading together ask these simple questions based on your selected passage: *What do these verses teach us about God? What can we be thankful for? What do these verses teach us about ourselves? How should these verses prompt us to pray for the day ahead?*
- We all get behind at times. Begin with **TODAY’S** reading rather than try to catch up when you get behind.
- Carve out **A SET TIME** for reading whether for personal and/or family devotion. Make it a habit.
- Use the chapters read to **SPARK CONVERSATION** at the dinner table or when meeting with other followers from our fellowship.
- Be sure to begin by asking **THE HOLY SPIRIT** to bless your reading. You can close by praying the **LORD’S PRAYER**.
- Tear off the Reading Plan and use it as a bookmark within your Bible. Mark off the day’s reading once it is complete.
