The Confession of Sin & Faith

After our preparation for worship and the beginning of the service called the *Adoration of God*, West Hills Presbyterian Church's worship service transitions to a time of *Confession of Sin and Faith*. After the *Hymn* or the *Hymn of Praise*, we transition to the *Confession of Sin*. This is historically an important portion of the service which has been included in the services of Calvin, Knox, Baxter and others throughout the centuries.

A typical question asked of pastors is "Why would we need to confess our sins if they have already been forgiven?" Bible teachers have often made a distinction between positional/judicial forgiveness and "relational/familial forgiveness. Positional or judicial forgiveness is

obtained by every believer in Christ. In our position as members of the body of Christ, we have been forgiven of every sin we have ever committed or ever will commit. The price paid by Christ on the cross has satisfied God's wrath against sin, and no further sacrifice or payment is necessary. When Jesus said, "It is finished," He meant it. Our *positional forgiveness* was obtained then and there.

During the *Prayer of Confession* in the worship service, we are dealing with "relational or familial forgiveness" like that between a father and a son. If a son disobeys his father, the son hinders fellowship with his father. He remains the son of his father. There is still a loving relationship. However, the relationship suffers. Their fellowship will be hindered until the son admits to his father that he has done wrong. It works the same way with God; our fellowship with Him is hindered until we confess our sin. When we confess our sin to God, the fellowship is restored. This is relational forgiveness.

Our sins are forgiven at salvation (positional/judicial forgiveness), but our daily fellowship with God needs to stay in good standing (relational/familial forgiveness). Proper fellowship with God cannot happen with unconfessed sin in our lives. Therefore, we confess our sins as we draw near to God in worship.

After our *Prayer of Confession*, we hear the *Assurance of Pardon*. In this divine dialogue of worship, God responds to our confession of sin. A portion of the Bible is read that clearly states the willingness and ability of God to forgive us in Jesus Christ. It is a comfort to believers that He draws close to us when we draw close to Him.

Next, we confess our faith together. We typically recite *The Apostles' Creed*, but we might use the Nicene Creed or our Confession of Faith or one of the Catechisms. The Apostles' Creed and Nicene Creeds have been in use in the Christian church since the third century and approved for use by all the Reformed liturgies.

The portion of the worship service that is a time of *Confession of Sin and Faith* concludes with the singing of *The Gloria Patri*. We sing the *Gloria Patri* in praise to God that there is abundant pardon and a fatherly affection that welcomes us in spite of our sin. Additionally, we have this common faith summarized by the ancient creeds, which binds us one with another and connects us to the family of God down through the centuries. So, it is appropriate to give glory to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit before we transition into the next portion of the service, which is called *The Means of Grace*.


SUMMER CRAFT AND FUN EVENING
