Worship By The Book

We continue our series on Reformed and Presbyterian worship. The worship of historic Presbyterianism stems from the conviction that worship must be according to the Scriptures. Jesus said God "must" be worshiping "in spirit and truth" (John 4:24). Merely being sincere or merely "having your heart in the right place" isn't enough. God "must" be worshiped with the right heart and in the right way directed by God's word. The Westminster Confession of Faith says:

"The acceptable way of worshiping the true God is instituted by himself, and so limited by his own revealed will, that he may not be worshiped In This Issue

according to the imaginations and devices of men, or the suggestions of Satan, under any visible representation, or any other way not prescribed in the Holy Scripture". (Westminster Confession of Faith 21.1)

The *elements* of worship are the activities included in worship and are restricted to what God has revealed in the Bible. The *Westminster Confession of Faith* lists:

"Prayer, with thanksgiving...The reading of the Scriptures with godly fear, the sound preaching and conscionable hearing of the Word...singing of psalms with grace in the heart...the due administration and worthy receiving of the sacraments instituted by Christ, are all parts of the ordinary religious worship of God...religious oaths, vows, solemn fastings, and thanksgivings upon special occasions". (Westminster Confession of Faith 21.3-5).

The *elements* are fixed and unchanging. However, there is greater freedom with the *forms* of the *elements*. Prayer is an *element* of worship, but the form might be a prayer of invocation or a prayer of confession or a prayer of intercession. Preaching is an *element* of worship, but the *form* might be a topical sermon or an expository sermon. Singing is an *element* of worship, but the form might be singing a hymn or singing a psalm. There is freedom in the form of the element of worship as long as the form doesn't compromise the integrity of the element. For example, the minister cannot preach the sermon through interpretive dance. Dancing is not preaching.

Finally, there are some issues related to worship that are decided by the "light of nature, and Christian prudence" (Westminster Confession of Faith 1.6). These are matters of circumstance. They are matters related to the time for worship on the Lord's Day, where you meet for worship, what lighting system you use, amplifying the voice of the preacher, and similar matters.

This teaching about the *elements*, *forms*, and *circumstances* of worship is called the *regulative principle* of worship. The heart of Reformed and Presbyterian worship is that God "must" be worshiped with the right heart and in the right way directed by God's word. So, West Hills Presbyterian Church strives to worship our great triune God according to the Scriptures.


