Christians have been know as "a people of the book" down through the centuries. Christianity was unique during its time because a book was central to all its worship and work. The Bible, the Old and New Testaments, were read aloud, interpreted and applied in early Christian

worship service. In the day to day lives of Christians, they centered their lives around the Bible. Christians studied, memorized and meditated on the Bible. Today, this doesn't seem strange. However, books were not an important part of pagan religious practices in ancient times. Other religions were more about rituals than doctrine or teaching. The "bookishness" of Christianity caused some of the ancient Romans to regard it more as a philosophy instead of a religion.

Christians should have the Bible at the center of their lives. It is the only rule for our faith and its practice. It tells us what we are to believe about God and what He requires of us. It is our special book written by God Himself.

While Christians are a people of *the book*, books in general and sound learning have always flourished wherever Christianity is found. This is part of the good legacy of Christianity. Yet, there are so many books about so many topics it can sometimes paralyze us. Furthermore, Richard Baxter advises that it's "the well reading of a few" books that makes us wise and "not the reading of many books." So, we should "be sure to have the best." If it is true of the body that "you are what you eat" and "garbage in; garbage out" is true for nutrition. It should not surprise us that a similar principle holds for the soul of man, and we should be more discerning about our diet of books.



At West Hills Presbyterian Church, we rejoice and give thanks that He has included us in this call to not only give thanks, but also to participate in making his deeds known throughout the world. West Hills is committed to supporting the spread of His Kingdom around the world, rejoicing with thanksgiving for every opportunity to share in His work. As 2018 approaches, the Foreign Missions Committee is excited about the upcoming Foreign Missions Month.

The theme for 2018 is, "**Advancing Christ's Kingdom Throughout the World**". We will continue the same popular format with a different focus each week. Fellowship begins at 9 a.m. with coffee, juice, and pastries/doughnuts. A joint Sunday school will follow allowing our featured guests and missionaries to share in depth what God is doing throughout the world. We will then worship together including a brief *MISSION MOMENT*.

We begin our focus a little earlier this year as we welcome keynote speaker, Dr. Lloyd Kim, on January 28th. February 18th brings us great news from Greece, another ever-changing landscape due to the refugee crises in Europe, as Phillip and Joy Kirkland update us on their work.
