Grace and Peace to you

West Hills Presbyterian Church's Worship - The Means of Grace

We have been considering the Biblical foundations and Reformed/Presbyterian heritage that shapes the worship

at West Hills Presbyterian Church (WHPC). Last month, we reflected on the portion of the worship service called *Confession of Sin and Faith*. This month, we will look more closely at the portion of the service called *The Means of Grace*. This section is the centerpiece of the worship service.

After singing the *Gloria Patria* for God forgiving our sin, we enter into a time of Bible reading. At WHPC, we typically have an Old Testament reading if the sermon text is a New Testament passage and *vice versa*. It is desirable for the *Scripture Reading* to have direct bearing on the text used for the sermon.

This encourages both the Old Testament and the New Testament being read within the service as recommended in *The Directory for the Public Worship of God*. Since God's Word is the way that the Holy Spirit works in Christians, we should encourage the reading of extended passages of Scripture and take the public reading of Scripture very seriously (cf. 1 Timothy 4:13). WHPC has a high view of Scripture, and it shows in the prime place of the reading and preaching of the Scriptures in our worship.

We respond to God speaking to us through the Bible by giving thanks in unison and praying together during the *Pastoral Prayer*. Prayer is an important means of grace. In my humble opinion, it is an indictment on the condition of the Church today that very little time and very little thought is given to public prayer. A reoccurring theme among visitors from non-historically Reformed/Presbyterian churches is surprise at the amount of prayer in the service. This is an issue that causes me great personal sadness. The minister leads the offering of prayers of thanksgiving and prayers of intercession during this portion of the service. The five-fold outline of intercession in Scripture and in the early church is: 1) civil authorities; 2) Christian ministry and mission; 3) salvation of all mankind; 4) sanctification of the saints; 5) the afflicted. We conclude our time praying *The Lord's Prayer* in unison. The use of the *Lord's Prayer* in worship is recommended in all the Reformed liturgies, including *The Directory for Public Worship*.

Then, we transition to *The Collection*. The collection of "alms" was made "on the first day of the week" in the early church (cf. 1 Cor. 16:1-2), and is an appropriate element of worship. This is an expression of thankfulness and charity when we collect contributions for charitable purposes. This should not be confused with the dubious practice of "presenting" the offering on the "altar." That highly ceremonial offertory practice is theologically misleading at best.

The Musical Offertory is special music presented to adorn the time of The Collection. We conclude The Collection and The Musical Offertory with the congregation singing of The Doxology. The congregation thanks and praises God with our gifts and voices, and The Offertory Prayer dedicates these gifts to God and asks for His blessing.

Finally, we have *The Reading of God's Word* and *The Sermon*. This is the essential element that makes our time together a worship service. This is the most important part of the worship service. God's holy Word is read, explained and applied to the hearers. The preaching of consecutive texts of Scripture was the most common format for preaching in the historical church. Predominately, a book of the Bible or a major section of a book of the Bible is preached from the beginning and continuing through, chapter by chapter or even verse by verse, in such a way that the whole message of the sacred writing is presented in an orderly fashion over a series of weeks or months. This is the *lector continua* method of preaching.

This is the portion of the service we call *The Means of Grace*. It is the center of our worship service and *The Reading of God's Word* and *The Sermon* are the epicenter. As we gather to worship this Sunday, give your full attention to this portion of the service and receive the good things God has for you in worship.

Did you know?

The Women's Ministry of WHPC has a limited number of scholarships available through the generosity of two of their former members.

Although Margaret Montgomery did not have children of her own, she had a special place in her heart for the children of missionaries. As a result, the **Margaret Montgomery Missions Endowment Fund** was established for missionaries and their immediate family or mission groups supported by WHPC. Acceptable uses include scholarships for missionaries and/or missionary children for either school on the foreign field, or any further education after high school on the foreign field or in the USA, and scholarships to aid the people who are served by the WHPC missionaries (priority will be given to children). Letters are sent to WHPC missionaries annually depending on funds available for scholarships at that time. Although funds are not available for this year, we anticipate they will be next year and letters will be sent at the appropriate time.

Because of her son's involvement in ministry, Becky Glass has been remembered with the **Becky Glass Scholarship Fund**. Any person enrolled in an approved theological seminary, Christian college or Christian university for the purpose of preparing for full-time Christian ministry, entering the mission field, or becoming a PCA pastor will be eligible to receive funds. Acceptable uses include tuition, room and board, or other necessary support while attending an approved theological seminary or Christian university or college.

We are blessed to have this opportunity to support Christian education for our children. If you have questions or need additional information, please let me know. Debbie Kinnard






