

• <u>ROBERT CHARLES ("RC") SPROUL</u>

- Born February 13, 1939, to Robert Cecil & Mayre Ann Sproul
- Converted at Westminster College (New Wilmington, PA)
- Read Scripture Voraciously and majored in Philosophy
- Married Vesta June 11, 1960

- Mentored by Dr. John Gerster
- Studied for PhD in Amsterdam under G.C. Berkouwer
- Moved to U.S. to begin teaching ministry
- Founded Ligonier Valley Study Center in 1971 (later moved to Orlando and renamed "Ligonier Ministries")


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

The Holiness $\mathsf{R}(\mathsf{C})$ SPROUL

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- SUPREME GREATNESS, MAJESTY
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"The root קדש originally means, 'to be set apart,' 'to be separated.' God is therefore called, 'the Holy One,' because <u>He exists in Himself and nothing can be compared to</u> <u>Him.</u> The metaphysical gap that exists between Him and the creature is therefore expressed by the concept of holiness. A very clear Scripture is 1 Samuel 2:2, 'There is none holy like the Lord: for there is none besides You; there is no rock like our God.'" (Geerhardus Vos)

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"[W]hen the word holy is applied to God, it does not signify one single attribute ... The word is used as a synonym for his deity. **That is, the word holy calls attention to all that God is.** It reminds us that His love is holy love, His justice is holy justice, His mercy is holy mercy, His knowledge is holy knowledge." (*HoG*, 39–40)

"God is inescapable. There is no place we can hide from Him. Not only does He penetrate every aspect of our lives, but He penetrates it in his majestic holiness. Therefore, we must seek to understand what the holy is.

We dare not seek to avoid it. There can be no worship, no spiritual growth, no true obedience without it. It defines our goal as Christians.


God has declared, 'Be holy, because I am holy' (Lev. 11:44). To reach that goal, we must understand what holiness is." (Sproul, HoG, 14)

Is 6:1–6 – "In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. ² Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. ³ And one called to another and said:

'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts;

the whole earth is full of his glory!'

⁴ And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. ⁵ And I said: 'Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!'"

Mark 4:35–41 – "On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, 'Let us go across to the other side.' ³⁶ And leaving the crowd, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. And other boats were with him. ³⁷ And a great windstorm arose, and the waves were breaking into the boat, so that the boat was already filling. ³⁸ But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion. And they woke him and said to him,

'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?'

³⁹ And he awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm. ⁴⁰ He said to them, 'Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?'

⁴¹ And they were filled with great fear and said to one another, *'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?''*
