

Background to the Book

- Originally a series of talks delivered at a pre-conference on missions for the London Inter-Faculty Christian Union on October 24, 1959.
- First published in book form in 1961.
- Addresses the perceived "problem" that if God meticulously sovereign, such a belief would have a negative effect upon evangelism.







I. Who is J.I. Packer?

- James Innell Packer is a British-born Canadian, born in Gloucester in July 1926.
- First educated at Corpus Christi College, Oxford, obtaining a Bachelor of Arts (1948), Master of Arts (1952), and Doctor of Philosophy (1955).
- Converted to Christ through a meeting of the Inter-Collegiate Christian Union.
- Ordained to Anglican Church, taught at Regents College (Vancouver).

"[This book] is a piece of biblical and theological reasoning, designed to clarify the relationship between three realities: **God's sovereignty, man's responsibility, and the Christian's evangelistic duty**. The last is its proper subject; divine sovereignty and human responsibility are discussed only so far as they bear on evangelism." (7–8)






- So WHY do Christians disagree about God's sovereignty in salvation?
- "The root cause is the same as in most cases of error in the Church the intruding of rationalistic speculations, the passion for systematic consistency, a reluctance to recognize the existence of mystery and to let God be wiser than men, and a consequent subjecting of Scripture to the supposed demands of human logic." (16)






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• *"An antinomy exists when a pair of principles stand side by side, seemingly irreconcilable, yet both undeniable."* (18)

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
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- The Error of "Hyper-Calvinism"!
- Defined: A system of theology framed to exalt the honor and glory of God but that wrongly minimizes the moral and spiritual responsibility of sinners, such that there should not be any invitation to salvation in the proclamation of the gospel.




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
- The Error of "Hyper-Calvinism"!
- "Young man, sit down. When God wants to convert the heathen, He will do it without your help or mine."




• "[G]oing out in love, as Christ's agent in the world, to teach sinners the truth of the gospel with a view to converting and saving them." (53)





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


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 - It does not affect the <u>RESPONSIBILITY</u> of the sinner for his or her reaction to the gospel.
