Pastor: What is adoption?

<u>All:</u> Adoption is an act of God's free grace, whereby we are received into the number, and have a right to all the privileges, of the sons of God.

<u>Pastor:</u> What is sanctification?

<u>All:</u> Sanctification is the work of God's free grace, whereby we are renewed in the whole man after the image of God, and are enabled more and more to die unto sin, and live unto righteousness.

Q. What do we pray for in the third petition?

A.
