

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




- York County ranks in the top ten counties in the United States for domestic violence.
- Of the 20,000 children 5 years and younger that live in in York County, almost 30% live in impoverished households.
- There are almost 12,000 abortions in SC each year and over 600 of those were in York County in 2017.
- It is estimated that 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 6 boys will experience sexual abuse. The median age for sexual assault is 9 years old.
- One in five homeless people suffers from untreated severe mental illness.
- Low literacy is the socioeconomic factor prison inmates have most in common.
- Academic failure in late elementary school results in increased risk for substance abuse, delinquency, teen pregnancy, school dropout, and violence.
- There are 50 organizations in York County that are equipped and passionate about remedying these issues.

### **Facts**

- Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central Carolinas has been serving youth in Mecklenburg County for more than 45 years.
- BBBS initiated services in York County in 2016 via a partnership with LPL Financial and expanded in 2017-18 via a partnership with the Boys & Girls Club of York County
- Research shows those with a Big Brother or Big Sister are more likely to steer clear of drugs and alcohol; do better in school; get along better with family and friends; and feel better about themselves
- BBBS served more than 1500 children in Mecklenburg, Cabarrus, and York counties, donating approximately 50,000 hours
- Received Charity Navigator's highest rating and listed consistently among The American Institute of Philanthropy's Top Rated Charities; received the Independent Charities Seal of Excellence
- Belongs to the Children's Charities of America (CCA) fundraising consortium, a nonprofit federation that pre-screens and certifies high-quality national charities working to protect and assist children in the United States and around the world



## **Facts**

Early Learning Partnership supports literacy programs including:

- Born To Read: Visit all new parents (who consent) at Piedmont Medical Center to inform on
  - importance of early literacy, connect to parenting resources, and provide a book, tote bag, early literacy tips, and bib
- **Wee Read:** Encourage parents with babies in the NICU to talk and read to their child to promote skin-to-skin bonding and provide a blanket and book with reading tips
- **Reach Out and Read:** Provide new, developmentally and age-appropriate books to children six months to age five during each pediatric well-child visit, offer anticipatory guidance and tips to

parents, and "prescribe" reading daily

## Jeffrey s Foundation

**Mission**: To promote CO awareness and prevent poisonings

Jeffrey died from carbon monoxide (CO) on June 8, 2013 in a hotel in Boone, North Carolina. His family started this foundation with this mission.

## **Facts**

- Everyone is at risk of CO poisoning. Each year, more than 400 Americans die from unintentional CO poisoning not linked to fires. More than 20,000 visit the emergency room and more than 4,000 are hospitalized. CO can't be seen, smelled or heard.
- Jeffrey's Foundation has donated 3,320 CO detectors to fire departments and 300 portable always-on CO monitors to first responders across South Carolina and North Carolina
- Shares Jeffrey's story to community organizations to increase awareness of carbon monoxide poisoning
- Sponsors Jeffrey's Brick Contest (Building with LEGO bricks was one of Jeffrey's favorite activities. We organize the contest to bring CO awareness and safety to families and to celebrate Jeffrey's life.)
- York County Carbon Monoxide Safety Project: Donated to York County first responders 2,000 CO alarms, 45 portable always-on monitors, and 20 hand-held CO fingertip diagnostic monitors



**Mission:** To serve our incarcerated population, both during incarceration and upon release back into York County, by recognizing the God-given potential of each person, and becoming part of what God is doing in their lives; To assist men and women as they step out with courage to embrace recovery from abortions they have experienced

## **Facts:**

- Publishes and offers free Biblically-based books to Chaplains and inmates to be used for individual and group studies
- Chaplain Potter has volunteered at Moss Justice Detention Center since 1998 and has authored five books, four in her *Help! I'm Locked Up* series which address hopelessness, identity crisis, anger, and purpose, and *Chloe's Gry* which is focused on abortion recovery.
- Her books offer the reader the opportunity to interact with God and themselves at a deeper level in the privacy of their cells.
- The *Help! I'm Locked Up* series has been used effectively in prisons, jails, and detention centers throughout the US, Canada, Africa, Albania, and India.
- *Chloe's Cry* is Chaplain Potter's personal journey toward healing and wholeness from an abortion she had in 1978. The book is a powerful tool for individual or group healing. Palmetto Women's Center in Rock Hill gives a gift copy of *Chloe's Cry* to participants who complete their abortion recovery.



**Mission**: To provide education and training to TANF recipients and other low-income individuals for occupations in the health care field that pay well and are expected to either experience labor shortages or be in high demand

### **Facts**

- HPOG is a study funded by the federal government which is being conducted to determine how these training opportunities help people, improve their skills and find better jobs. During the study, all new eligible applicants will be selected by lottery to participate in these training opportunities. Not all eligible applicants will be selected to participate in these opportunities.
- Project HOPE is a unique program consisting of five phases: (1) Recruitment/Selection, (2) Boot Camp, (3) Introduction to Health Care, (4) Healthcare Career Preparation, and (5) Employment Readiness and Placement
- The 13 approved curricula include: Registered Nurse (RN), Dental Assistant, Pharmacy Tech, Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN), Emergency Medical Tech (EMT), Paramedic, Medical Assistant, Medical Records Tech, Medical Lab Tech, Phlebotomist, Cardiovascular Tech (EKG), Patient Care Tech, and Certified Nursing Assistant





**Mission:** To engage York County's citizens to collaborate for youth substance abuse reduction, risk minimizations, and healthier lifestyles through capacity building, environmental strategies, education, community awareness, and evaluation

### **Facts**

- Partners with York County's four school districts, Catawba Indian Nation, SC DHEC, SC Department of Juvenile Justice, Atrium Health, Piedmont Medical Center, Keystone, WRHI, all York County police departments, Sheriff's Office, 16th Circuit Solicitor's Office, Coroner's Office, York County Regional Chamber, Elks Lodge, Williams and Fudge, and Coca Cola
- "All YOUth on Board" (students representing eight high schools), plans awareness events for York County middle and high schools
- The Blunt Truth YC is an initiative to spark discussion in SC about the issues surrounding the legalization of marijuana and regarding marijuana's impact on the community. The primary goal of this group is to provide information about the science and harm of marijuana use, especially to the teen brain.
- Operation Medicine Drop provides a safe and legal way to dispose of unwanted, expired medicine and to keep dangerous prescription drugs out of the hands of our youth.
   There are drop-off locations at all county police departments and the York County Sheriff's Office.
- The Alcohol Enforcement Team conducts compliance checks at local merchants and is intended to implement evidence-based environmental strategies to reduce underage alcohol use and its harmful consequences.

### **Facts**

- York County First Steps strives to be the resident expert in early intervention for young children and their families.
- Educational "At Risk" factors include poverty, low birth weight, teen mothers, children with delays and disabilities, and children that have been exposed to neglect, abuse, depression, or drug abuse from their parents.
- York County has over 4000 children living at or below poverty level.
- York County First Steps serves as a major portal for families with young children to connect to services, a community convener to increase public awareness regarding the importance of early education initiatives, and helps marshal needed community resources to provide the most effective services for the children they serve.
