

First Victims of Our Lord

Welcome to where the Faithful gather around the Lamb of God to receive from Him relief in time of suffering, forgiveness for sin, life in the midst of death, and salvation from those who seek to destroy and undermine true Faith. May you take to heart these blessings given in this Holy Mass.

The Theme of Today's Liturgy

The Holy Innocent Martyrs are the baby boys killed by King Herod when he hears of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem (*Gospel*). With their death, they both precede and follow the Lamb (Christ) where He will eventually go (*Epistle*). At the same time, their silent martyrdom speaks Our Lord's praise (*Introit*) and emboldens us to pray for such faith to join their witness in our living (*Collect*).

The Holy Eucharist

What saves the Innocent Martyrs is not their own blood, but the Blood of Christ which, in their death, they partake in. You also, in the Blessed Sacrament, partake of and receive the same life-giving and life-saving Blood of Christ.






