

**Faith Comes By Hearing** 



Welcome to where Faith is created and strengthened, enlivened and bolstered by the preached and distributed Word of God. May this same Word of God renew and increase in you a lively and holy Faith in God.

The Theme of Today's Liturgy To trust in God's mercy means to rejoice in His salvation and give thanks for His bounty no matter how well or badly things go (*Introit*). That mercy of God is given in His sure, strong promises which comfort us in our present suffering by encouraging us in the hope that this merciful Word gives (*Gospel*). That mercy of God is a mercy that heals our sinful souls, that reaches out to the poor in heart, and that delivers the troubled (*Gradual*). In short, God is love, and His love dwells in us (*Epistle*). Our prayer, then, is that God will grant us the grace to hear and take to heart His Word, and thereby please Him both in will and deed (*Collect*).

**The Sermon** He who knew riches that Dives will never know, the riches of heaven, made Himself the poorest of men. He humbled Himself. He was truly poor in spirit. By scourge and cross He learned greater sufferings that Lazarus ever knew. And there, on Calvary, He endured the searing torments of Hades as He was forsaken by His Father. But He remained faithful. What He did, He did in love for you. He took away your sin. He clothed Himself not in purple and fine linen, but in your transgressions. And by His death He made Himself the Propitiation for your sins.

**The Holy Eucharist** To the poor in heart, Our Lord gives His rich and plentiful mercy. Through the Blessed Sacrament, that loving mercy of God becomes more that just words. It unites itself to our skin and bones so that the love of God truly does live and make its home in you.

#### THE PSALM FOR THIS WEEK IS PSALM 13. PRAY IT EVERY DAY!

As you pray Psalm 13, keep in mind Lazarus and your own suffering in mind, body or soul. God's help often seems so far away and so slow in coming (v 1-2). Our cry and prayer, then, is for God to hear us, open our eyes to see and take comfort in His mercy, and not be moved away from Him when troubled (v 3-4). So, in spite of God's seeming slowness and our own wavering faith, God continues to deal with us from the rich abundance of His never-ending loving-kindness (v 5-6). That is both our confidence and our hope.
