

The Lord and His People



The Lord visits His people in the Gospel and Sacraments. He welcomes all to receive and take to heart the things that make for peace. You are welcomed and invited to partake of the "Peace of the Lord" which remains and abides with you always!

The Theme of Today's Liturgy If the Lord is not on our side, then He is against us. He afflicts those who rebel against Him, but He delivers in peace the souls of those who rely on Him (*Introit*). Our confidence is

that the Lord declares His power chiefly in showing us mercy and pity (*Collect*), and that he shelters us under the shadow of His wings (*Gradual*). This faith encourages us to cry out day and night to the Lord of our salvation (*Alleluia*) for grace to live in and from His Word (*Collect*). That grace Our Lord gives in various ways by the Spirit who knits us together as one Body in Christ (*Epistle*). Only in this gracious visitation by our God do we receive the things that make for our peace (*Gospel*).

The Sermon They presumed grace because of their piety, false though it was - which, at its base, is simply to trust that God will overlook sin, even that God would reward transgression - which is blasphemy, a violation of the entire First Table of the Law. But God is a God of grace. And while there is always Law for the sinner, there is Gospel hope for all who believe. So the Words of the Prophet, and the Words our Lord spoke outside of Jerusalem, include a Promise: The things that make for peace. He was not referring to peace with the Romans. The peace He promised is peace with God, a peace that surpasses understanding, a peace only He can give.

The Holy Eucharist The things that make for your peace are the Body and Blood of Our Lord as he gives Himself to you in His Supper. Here is the "peace of the Lord" which exceeds your understanding and outdoes your hopes and desires.

THE PSALM FOR THIS WEEK IS PSALM 55. PRAY IT EVERY DAY!

When you feel let down or as if some injustice has been done to you, this is a good Psalm to pray (v 1-8). The prayer is for God to come through as He promises (v 1). Two things are asked for: destruction of those who oppress us (v 9-15) and deliverance by the hand of God (v 15-21). The two are tied together. For the Lord can finally save our life by killing those who bring death. Therefore, we should be confident that the Lord will sustain us (v 22) while destroying the wicked (v 23).
