

The Church In The World



At Holy Mass, we receive Our Lord Jesus Christ and His gifts. We do this, not to escape the world, but so that the honor we show others might be properly founded in the worship and honor we give Our Lord. We welcome you, then, to join us in honoring Our Lord God as He gives us His mercy in the Gospel and Sacraments.

The Theme of Today's Liturgy Based on Our Lord's promise that He thinks thoughts of peace and not evil toward us (*Introit*), we beseech Him to absolve us of our sins and offenses so that we may be delivered by His bountiful goodness (*Collect*). In this way, we rely on our Baptism which grants us citizenship in heaven (*Epistle*) where the rule is not fairness, but mercy. It is this distinction between the kingdom of God and the kingdom of the world that Our Lord teaches the Pharisees who seek to trap Him (*Gospel*). In doing so, He focuses our attention on His forgiveness

(Offertorium), from which flows all honor and respect given to God through His earthly and churchly authorities.

The Sermon What is true wealth? To the fallen flesh, money, power and fame seem like the answer to all your troubles. That's what the devil offered the Christ. But true wealth lies, as the Scriptures teach, in Wisdom. But not an earthly wisdom acquired through years of street smarts or multiple degrees. True Wisdom is a Divine Wisdom, a Wisdom from above, a Wisdom that surpasses all earthly understanding. Solomon, one of the richest men in the history of the world, writes that Wisdom is better than rubies, that all the things one may desire cannot be compared to Wisdom. The fruit of Wisdom is better than gold, the revenue of Wisdom better than choice silver. So in a real way you are presented with a choice: hedonism for a few years of earthly wealth; or eternal riches that never end. But the riches of heaven don't make earthly headlines. The Lord of the Church uses a coin to teach of true wealth. If you can hear it, it is in rendering to God what is God's that true wealth is found. To give to Caesar what is Caesar's makes a man poorer. But to give to God what is due God makes one rich unto eternity, for that is only possible by faith. Only faith, saving faith, ascribes all power, honor, glory, riches and might to God alone. And that is done only by true Wisdom.

The Holy Eucharist Rendering to God the things that are God's culminates in receiving the Chalice of Salvation and calling on the Name of the Lord. Then we are both honoring the Lord, and giving Him the worship He desires—a heart that clings in faith to Him and to His promises.

THE PSALM FOR THIS WEEK IS PSALM 85. PRAY IT EVERY DAY!

Our Lord grants us His grace and favor by granting forgiveness and turning away from us His justified anger (vv. 1-3). Our prayer is that the Lord continue to restore us, that He not lash out in anger but show us His mercy (vv. 4-7). For our part, we will not worry, but will hear and take to heart the peace He speaks and the salvation He brings (vv. 8-9). This peace and salvation is ultimately tied to His Son who is the Truth that springs out of the earth (the Blessed Virgin) and the Peace which brings God's goodwill to men (vv. 10-11). His Son Jesus is the good Our Lord gives, the Righteous One who goes before Him, and in whose footsteps we walk in our life and living (vv. 12-13).
