Compline is the Church's bedtime prayer office. Originally prayed in the monastery as part of eight prayer offices throughout the day, it is prayed in congregations, religious communities, or in the home.

The leader sings the portions in regular font; everyone sings the portions in **bold font.**

It is appropriate to speak the office if necessary.

It is appropriate to abbreviate the office for families with small children. An abbreviated form is found on page 11 of this booklet.

It is appropriate to make the sign of the cross in remembrance of Baptism where indicated with \mathbf{A} .
