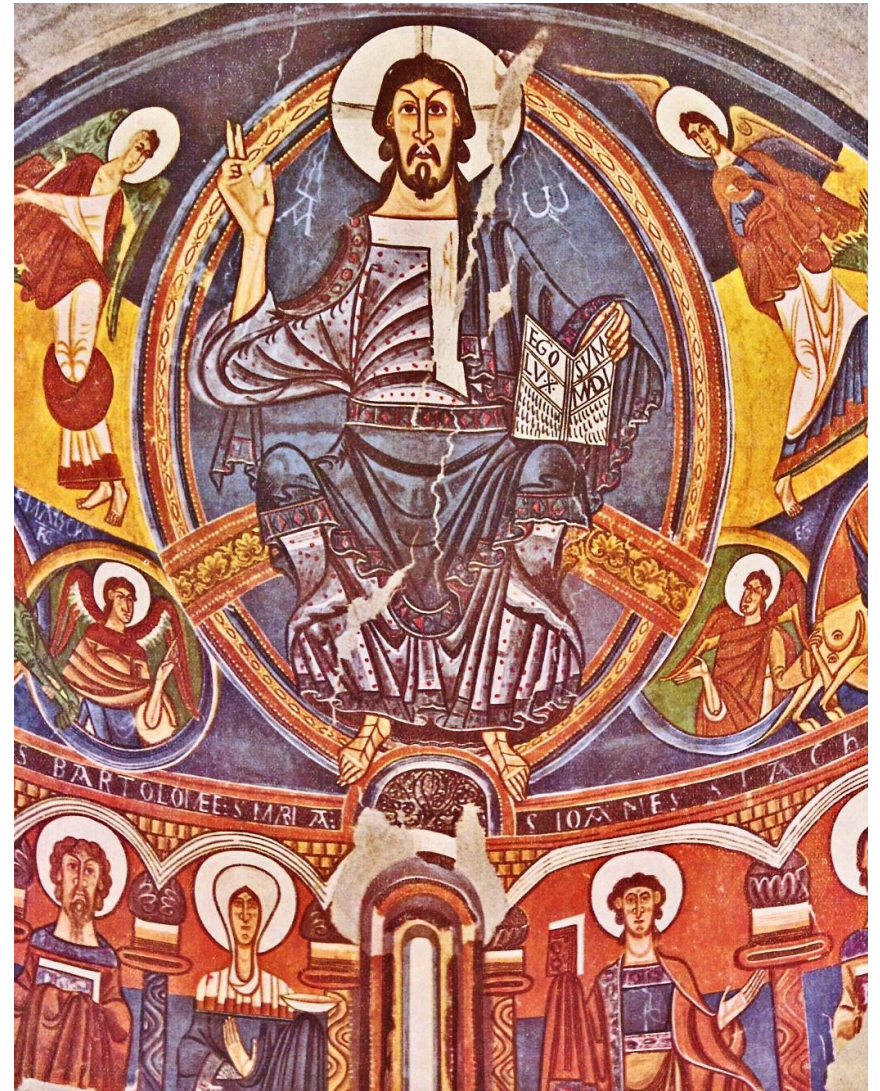


Jubilate means “Make a joyful shout”, from the first verse of the Psalm 66. This Psalm expresses the joy and thanksgiving that are the response of faith to God’s great creative and redemptive acts. This joyful Psalm attributes praise and glory to God alone, for it is He that “turned sea into dry land” to deliver His people from bondage through the Red Sea waters, and it is He that “keeps our soul among the living,” delivering His people from bondage to sin and death by the waters of Holy Baptism. He alone is worthy of our worship and prayers. Those who have attended our daily Matins in the Chapel will recognize the last two verses of Psalm 66: “But certainly God has heard me; He has attended to the voice of my prayer. Blessed be God, Who has not turned away my prayer, nor His mercy from me!”
