

PRESENTERS

The Rev. Dr. Geoffrey Boyle is Assistant Professor of Pastoral Ministry and Missions, and Director of Field Education at Concordia Theological Seminary. He holds a BA in history and ancient civilizations and biblical studies from the University of Michigan, the MDiv from Concordia Theological Seminary, and PhD through Wycliffe and St. Michael's College at the University of Toronto. He served as senior pastor of Grace Lutheran Church and Trinity Lutheran Church in Wichita, and served as president of the Eighth Day Institute.

The Reverend Dr. Burnell Eckardt recently retired as Pastor of St. Paul's Evangelical-Lutheran Church of Kewanee, Illinois. He received the Ph.D. from Marquette University and the MDiv and S.T.M. from Concordia Theological Seminary. Fr. Eckardt is the General Editor of *Gottesdienst: A Quarterly Journal of the Evangelical-Lutheran Liturgy*, and author of *Every Day Will I Bless Thee: Meditations for the Daily Office*; *The New Testament in His Blood: A Study of the Holy Liturgy of the Christian Church*; and compiler of *The Lutheran Propers*.

The Rev. Fr. Stefan Gramenz and the Rev. Fr. Evan Scamman are engaged in the creation of a Lutheran Missal based on Lutheran agenda of the Reformation era. Fr. Scamman is the Pastor of St. Paul Evangelical-Lutheran Church, Greenwich, Connecticut. He received his MDiv from Concordia Theological Seminary. Fr. Gramenz is Pastor of The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Christ the King of Pawling, New York. He received his MDiv from Concordia Theological Seminary.

The Reverend Dr. Daniel Reuning is Kantor and Church Musician at Redeemer Lutheran Church, Ft. Wayne, and an emeritus member of the faculty of CTS, where he served as Dean of Chapel for 31 years. He holds a Doctorate in Musicology from the University of Illinois, a Masters degree in Sacred Music and Liturgy from Union Theological Seminary, and the BDiv from Concordia Seminary St. Louis. Dr. Reuning is the Founder and Director Emeritus of the Fort Wayne Bach Collegium, and principal creator of the new Protes'tant hymnal *Te Laudamus*.

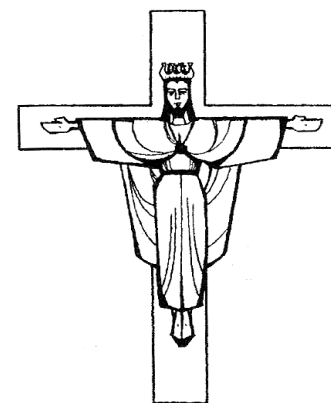

“Reading the Holy Scriptures Sacramentally”

This Twenty-seventh annual St. Michael Liturgical Conference will focus on the theology of the Divine Service, the Sacramental reading of the Holy Scriptures, the Collects of the Reformation era, the new Protes'tant hymnal “Te Laudamus”, and the role of the Our Father in the development of the ancient Canon.

Keynote Address: Rev. Dr. Goeffrey Boyle

Dr. Boyle will introduce a Sacramental approach to Scriptural hermeneutics, “A Real-Presence Reading of Scripture”. In considering Holy Writ from the perspective of the Sacraments, he will address the very character of the Scriptures.

Q & A with Dr. Boyle - Fr. Mark Braden, Pastor of Zion, will moderate Q & A with Dr. Boyle, allowing conference attendees to interact with Dr. Boyle on his keynote presentation.

A Panel Discussion by this years’ presenters, joined by select *Gottesdienst* editors and distinguished guests, will follow the Q&A.

Workshops: The Collects of the Reformation, *Te Laudamus*, and the Lord’s Prayer in the Mass:

Fr. Eckardt will discuss the use of the Lord’s Prayer in the Holy Mass. He will present the concept that the Our Father was seminal to the development of the ancient Canon.

Dr. Reuning will present and explore sections of the recently published Protes'tant hymnal, *Te Laudamus*.

Frs. Gramenz and Scamman will present the fruits of their research on the historic Collects of the Reformation era churches in Germany.

Dr. Emily Solomon will perform the Organ Recital. Dr. Solomon is Cantor of Zion Evangelical-Lutheran Church of Detroit, Executive Director for the Academy of Early Music in Ann Arbor, and Co-Director of LCMS Connections. She holds the Doctor of Musical Arts in Sacred Music from the University of Michigan. She was awarded the Rackham Dissertation Fellowship in support of her research on the *Evangelical Lutheran Hymn-Book* of 1912.

Rev. Dr. David Petersen, Pastor of Redeemer Evangelical-Lutheran Church of Fort Wayne, will preach at the Solemn High Mass.

DIRECTIONS

Zion is located at 4305 Military in southwest Detroit, Michigan. The church is one block east of Livernois, and one block north of Michigan Avenue. Secure parking is provided in the lot across the street from the church.

From I-94 take exit 212 (Livernois). Turn right (south) to Buchanan. Go left on Buchanan one block to Military. Turn right.

From I-75 take exit 46 (Livernois). Cross Livernois to Dragoon. Turn left (north) on Dragoon. Cross Michigan Avenue to Buchanan. Turn right onto Buchanan one block to Military. Turn right.
