

The Nativity of St. John the Baptizer

June 24, 2018

His Name Shall Be John



It is a great comfort to faith to be reassured of the coming of the Savior. The saints of Old were saved by faith in the Coming One, we of the New by faith in the One who came, and who soon comes again. As John preached, even before his birth, the Coming One, so too do you hear, and receive this day, the One who comes to you in Word and Sacrament for your salvation.

The Theme of Today's Liturgy "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord'," (Introit) is a voice you hear in this Divine Service as you prepare to receive Him. It is He that takes away the sins of the world (Collect), He that is the Comfort spoken to the people of Old (Old Testament). He was from the beginning (Epistle), and yet was and is, and ever will be. Not John, but the Christ He preached is He who visits and redeems His people (Gospel), that your fellowship be with the Father and His Son.

The Sermon The Baptizer's Prophetic work had already begun. At the Visitation of Elizabeth his mother by Mary, the Mother of God, that child still in the darkness of the womb of his mother leaped for joy at the presence of the True Light, yet in the mysterious womb of the Virgin. The nascent Baptizer already, even before his birth, pointed to the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. He performed his bounding preaching of the Gospel that you might know, not John, but the Lord to whom he would point in his life, and through the accounts of the Evangelists, the Lord and Savior to whom he points you even this day.

The Holy Eucharist The Coming Lord places you into fellowship with the Holy Church as you eat His Body and drink His Blood. He is the Horn of Salvation raised up, as the Pastor elevates the Bread which is His Body, and the Cup which is His Blood. Eating and drinking, believing, your fellowship is with Him, that you live in holiness and righteousness all the days of your life, and your joy is made full.

THE PSALM FOR THIS WEEK IS PSALM 27. PRAY IT EVERY DAY!

Several times throughout the year, Psalm 27 is the Psalm for the week. As you pray it this week, notice the confident defiance, especially in v 1-3, 7-10. Notice also whence the strength comes to withstand whatever haunts you—not from your own inner resources, but from the Lord and His house (v 4-6, 8). Finally, notice that the Lord not only gives you the strength to face your fears but also the confidence to wait in hopeful anticipation for His ready help (v 13-14).
